Tennessee Williams' Pulitzer Prize-winning play about greed and deception in a patriarchal Southern family. Big Daddy is dying as his son Brick, an alcoholic ex-football player, drinks his days away and resists the affections of his wife "Maggie the Cat", and members of the family greedily attempt to capture Big Daddy's inheritance. This is a timeless classic - one of the best dramas ever written for the stage.

**May 22 - 26**

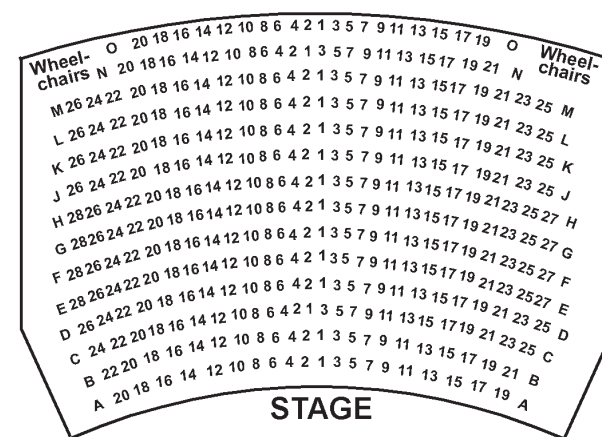
**May 29 - June 2**

## Ticket Policy

- Current subscribers are guaranteed renewal of their seats until **June 3rd, 2006**.
- Seats are then assigned on a "first come, first served" basis.
- We regret **we cannot offer refunds**; however,
- Subscribers may exchange their tickets for another performance of the same play, **depending on seat availability**.
- Exchanges must occur at least 48 hours before the performance date shown on the ticket.
- Exchange requests will only be processed once the tickets to be exchanged are received in the Box Office.
- There will be a \$1.00 administration fee for each ticket exchanged.

N.B. There is a mail box by the front entrance of the Playhouse for ticket drop-off at any time.
