## TICKET POLICY:

Current subscribers are guaranteed renewal of their seats until **Tuesday May 31, 2016.**

Seats are then assigned first come, first served:

- first, to change requests by current subscribers
- then, to requests for new subscriptions

We regret we cannot offer refunds; however:

- Subscribers may exchange their tickets for another performance of the same play, depending on seat availability.
- Exchanges must occur at least 48 hours before the performance date shown on the original ticket.
- Exchange requests will only be processed once the tickets to be exchanged are received in the Box Office. There is a mail box by the front entrance of the Playhouse for ticket drop-off at any time.
- We charge a \$1.00 administration fee for each ticket exchanged or replaced.
- For the five main plays, a student (with ID) may purchase a rush seat for \$5 from 5 to 8 pm on performance nights.



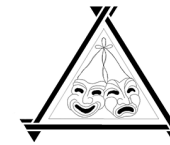

### The Last Romance by Joe DiPietro

Directed by Heather Walt

September 20-24 & September 27-October 1, 2016

On an ordinary day in a routine life, Ralph, an elderly widower and opera lover, takes a different path on his daily walk – one that unexpectedly leads to a second chance at love. But it's like opera – “someone loves someone, but it can't work out, because life always gets in the way”. This tender, romantic comedy explores the relationships between men and women in their golden years and love as an antidote to loneliness.



### Equivocation by Bill Cain

Directed by Alain Chamsi

November 8-12 & 15-19, 2016

2016 marks the 400th anniversary of William Shakespeare's death and we chose to mark it with this play, which features Shakespeare as the main character. *Equivocation* is a play about telling the truth in difficult times. Indeed, it poses this intriguing question: What if the government commissioned William Shakespeare to write the definitive history of a national crisis, the Gunpowder Plot, in one of his plays?



### Schoolhouse by Leanne Brodie

Directed by Joy Forbes

February 7-11 & 14-18, 2017

Full of warmth and poignant humour, *Schoolhouse* evokes a way of life shared by generations of rural Canadians, exploring timeless themes of rejection, of compassion, of damage, of hope. Laugh, cry or rekindle memories of life in a one-room schoolhouse. This is an inspiring play that celebrates the one-room schoolhouse era and is a tribute to all good teachers, but especially those young women who worked so hard to help their students succeed.



### The Melville Boys by Norm Foster

Directed by Steve Truelove

March 28-Apr. 1 & April 4-8, 2017

This classic Canadian comedy by Norm Foster explores sibling rivalry and resentment as well as themes of love, loyalty, and compassion. Two brothers, Owen and Lee Melville, arrive at the family lakeside cabin toting beer and anticipating nothing more strenuous than a relaxing weekend of fishing. However, the arrival of two sisters, Loretta and Mary, throws their plans out of whack. The women spend the night and are the catalysts to a tender, unsentimental, and often hilarious look at what happens when four lives in transition touch common ground.



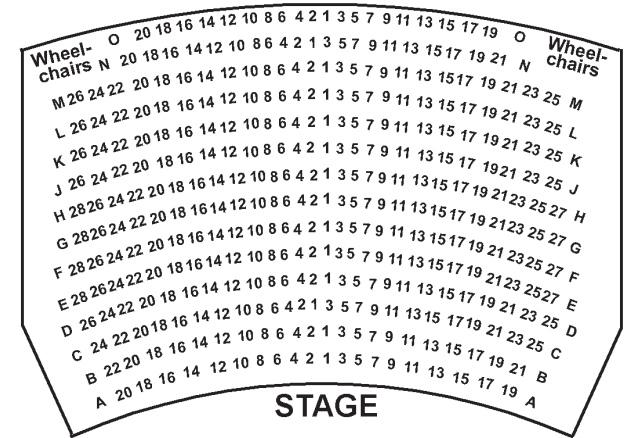
### Treasure Island by Ken Ludwig based on the novel by Robert Louis Stevenson

Robert Louis Stevenson's swashbuckling tales of pirates and buried treasure is an enduring classic about 14 year old Jim Hawkins who yearns for adventure. Along the way he meets the infamous Long John Silver, who is an intriguing mix of good and evil, and a whole host of legendary buccaneers. Ludwig's award-winning adaptation embraces both the mythic and the darker aspects of piracy to produce a coming-of-age story with a real heart to it. With thrilling sword fights and cutthroat mutiny on the high seas, *Treasure Island* is a gripping adventure for the whole family!
